- Implement validated screening tools and follow appropriate reporting pathways when trafficking is suspected.
- Activate Sentara's internal response procedures to ensure timely and appropriate intervention.
- Collaborate effectively with law enforcement, victim-service organizations, and Homeland Security to support safe intervention, documentation, and continuity of care for potential victims.

Human trafficking often goes unnoticed in healthcare settings. This educational session will provide practical tools and guidance to help clinicians recognize warning signs and respond with confidence and compassion.
